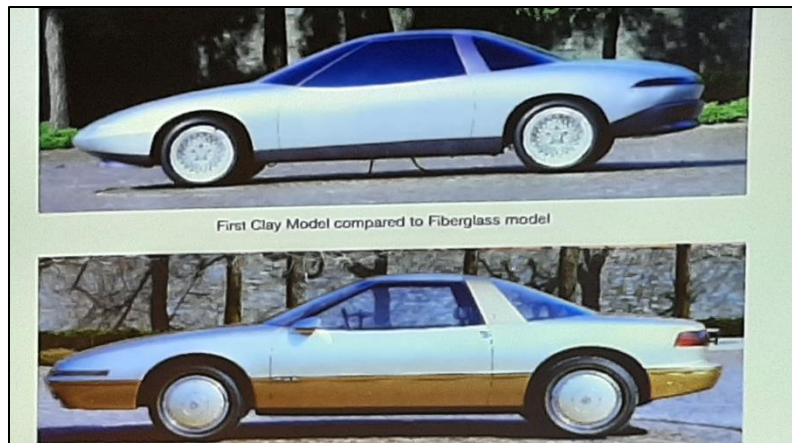
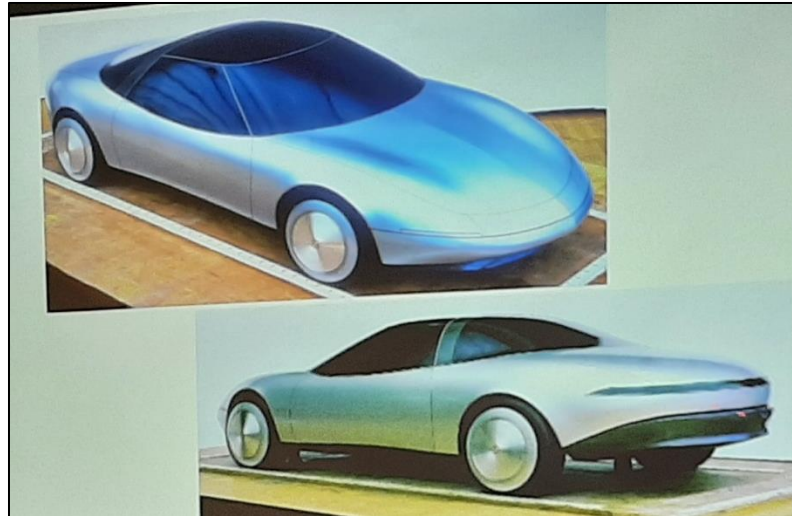
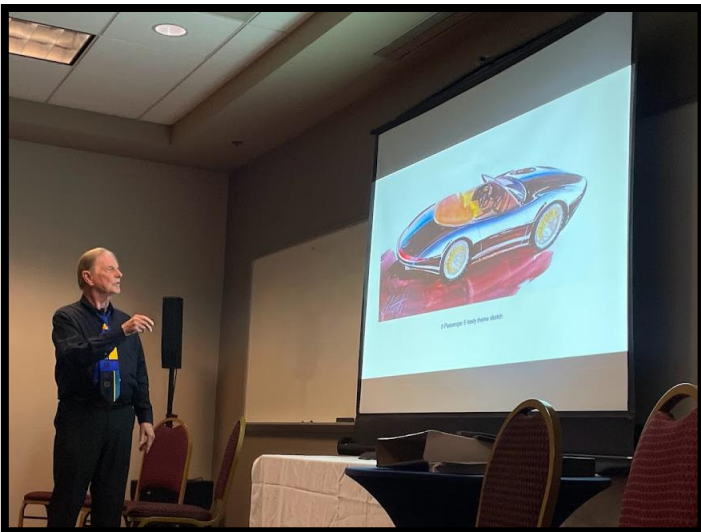
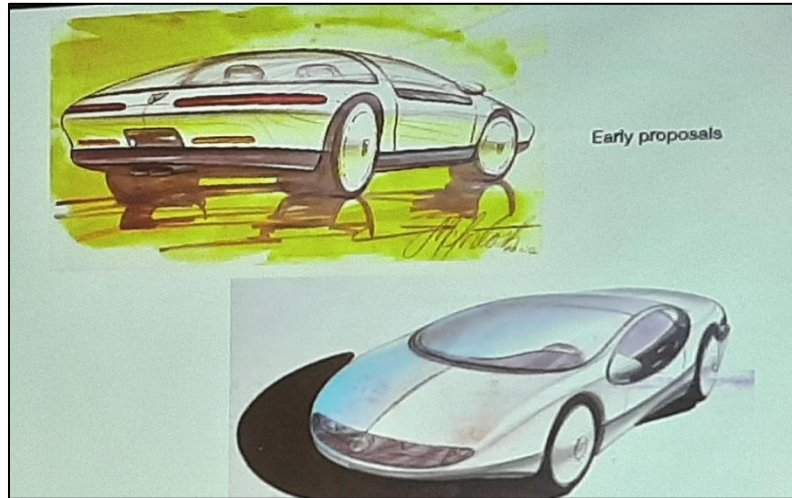
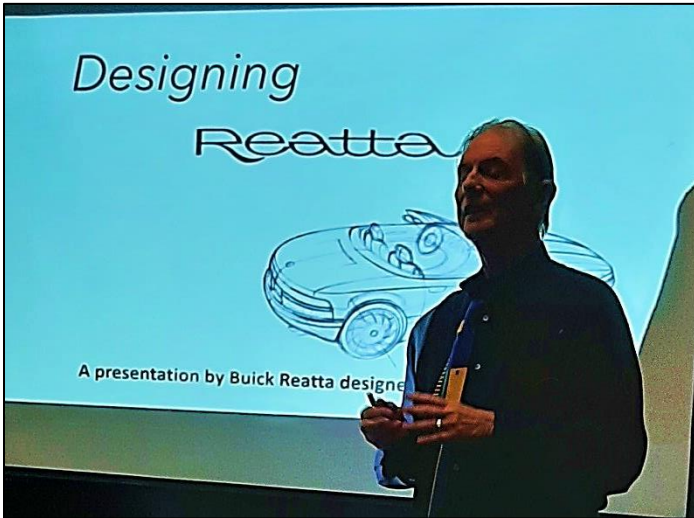
In closing, I'd like to congratulate Anne Gibson on receiving the 2022 Peterson Award. The award was presented at the Reatta Rendezvous on Friday.
